## TRAINEE COMPETENCIES INTERMEDIATE TRAINER Canine Obedience Training Program

## Intermediate Trainer S75 (Successful training of dogs for 48 weeks with a minimum of 2,880 hours to earn credential)

- Maintain competencies from Handler and Basic Trainer positions previously learned. (see Handler and Basic Trainer credentials)
- Train animals to obey commands and perform additional tasks that may include tricks.
- Coach, encourage and motivate dogs.
- Demonstrate leadership skills, which may include practicing as Lead Trainer and mentoring other trainers.
- Develop team building, communication and teaching skills.
- Teach positive reinforcement dog training techniques in group or class settings.
- Observe the behavior and personality of the dogs to assist basic trainers by suggesting and demonstrating a variety of training techniques for problem solving.
- Ensure medications are given or applied correctly.
- Report progress regarding the dog to relevant staff, program coordinator and the community partner.
- Convey information to the future dog owner through written documentation.
  - o Create and develop a journal for adopters to continue training at home.
- Interact with adopters and volunteers in a professional manner.
- Demonstrate written and verbal skills.
- Ability to work independently with minimal direction.
- Organize demonstration and present self and dog professionally to full audience at graduation.
- May cue or signal dogs during demonstration.
- Pass training skills test.
